

City of Annapolis Citizens Committee to Review Alcoholic Beverage Laws

Interim Report

I. Overview

On January 25, 2010, the Annapolis City Council established the Citizen Committee to Review Alcoholic Beverage Laws (Committee), pursuant to the adoption of R-73-09Amended. This 15-member committee, confirmed by the City Council, includes alcoholic beverage licenses holders and residents. The committee is responsible for reviewing the City's alcoholic beverage laws, including the limit on 2AM licenses and recent increases in alcoholic beverage license fees. The committee is required to submit an interim report to the Mayor and City Council by April 1, 2010 "stipulating any recommendations for substantive changes," with a final report due by July 15, 2010.

At this time the Committee does not recommend any substantive changes to the tasks established by the City Council, the committee membership or the deadlines established by R-73-09Amended.

However, the Committee will take this opportunity to expand on the specific request of the Council regarding the content of the interim report and update the Council on its progress, to include the Committee methodology in moving forward, public outreach efforts, and next steps.

II. Committee Membership

The Committee includes members who represent four of the City's eight wards. The first meeting of the Committee was held on February 28, 2010, and the committee has continued to meet weekly. Attendance and participation by the committee members and the public have been high. The committee is currently working collaboratively to clarify issues and formulate its recommendations.

III. Methodology

The first charge of the committee has been to organize a manageable approach to the tasks set forth by the City Council. The Committee has broken the tasks into four general categories, in no order of importance:

Fees,
Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (ABCB),
Enforcement, and
Land Use (Zoning).

The issue of the 2AM closing time will be most effectively addressed subsequent to the fact finding process and the public hearing to be held by the Committee on April 29, 2010, as discussed further in this report.

The level of expertise within the committee on the issues is diverse. In order to comprehensively understand the issues the committee continues to have an excellent exchange of information. In addition, the Committee has gathered data and reviewed (in part), the State Code Article 2B Alcoholic Beverages, City Code Title 7 Alcoholic Beverage License, City of Annapolis Alcoholic Beverage Control Board Rules and Regulations (Revised December 5, 2007), City Code Title 21 Planning and Zoning, and the 1993 Ward One Sector Study.

The Committee has and will continue to collectively seek additional information and clarification on the issues. At the writing of this report information has been provided by the Office of Law, the Planning and Zoning Department, the Annapolis Police Department, and the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. IV. Chairman's Comments

On the issue of liquor license fees, the information that has been provided at the writing of this report has not provided a transparent methodology for the significant increase in the FY2010 "fee for service" (R-18-09Amended). However, additional information has been requested from the Department of Finance that will be evaluated by the Committee.

The ABCB has vast authority to regulate alcoholic beverage licenses. The existing policies and procedures of the ABCB should be further evaluated which could result in an increase in the visibility of the ABCB in the issue of late night drinking and enforcement. There are a number of questions relating to the interrelationship of zoning (land use), enforcement and the ABCB (licensing). The committee continues to work on the overlaps and distinctions.

The Annapolis Police Department has participated fully in the Committee's fact-finding process. The APD does work with the ABCB in performing enforcement functions, while at the same time addressing the multitude of issues associated with late night drinking. However, liquor license enforcement is not the sole responsibility of the APD. The cooperation between the ABCB and the APD is a critical relationship, and will be addressed in the final report.

It is apparent that the issue of 2AM closing should not be dealt with in isolation from the other issues of enforcement, land use and the ABCB. Subsequent to the fact-finding process and the public hearing to be held by the Committee on April 29, 2010, the committee is confident that the recommendation to the City Council will help to establish a framework for transparent and accountable licensing in the City. A recommendation that may resolve the question of whether a strict limit on the number of 2AM licenses downtown is appropriate.

V. Public Outreach

The Committee has a web site, which is found on the Planning Department's home page, where the agenda and meeting minutes are posted weekly. In addition, there are quick links to a number of relevant sites and information.

On March 8, 2010 the Committee sent an informational mailing to an extensive list of stakeholders, which advised them of the Committee's web site, and extended an invitation to attend the Committee meetings and public hearing. The Committee's public hearing is scheduled on April 29, 2010 at 7:00 in the City Council Chambers. Notice will be advertised in the local paper.

The Committee continues to encourage and provide an opportunity for the public who attends the meetings to comment. At the writing of this report, approximately 25 members of the public have attended the Committee meetings.

VI. Next Steps

Moving into April, the Committee will begin to formulate its recommendations, and hold a public hearing on April 29, 2010. Subsequent to the public hearing, the Committee will final its recommendations and draft the report. As Chair of the Committee, I have committed to the members that the draft will be fully vetted and reflect the membership as a whole.

The Committee includes members who philosophically disagree on certain issues, and while I hope that through this process many of those differences will be bridged, there may be issues where reasonable people will disagree. I intend, where those differences are insurmountable, to include the dissenting opinion in the report where the Committee finds it appropriate.


